

**SART ~ Sexual Assault Response Team**  
**To Aid Adult Sexual Assault Clients**

SART Program is a collaboration of efforts between C/SARA Foundation, Mercy Memorial Hospital, Family Shelter of Southern Oklahoma, Marshall Co. Family Support Services, District Attorney's Office and Law Enforcement agencies across southern Oklahoma. SART-Sexual Assault Response Team will serve adult victims of sexual assault in Carter, Love, Marshall, Murray and Johnston Counties.

Medical forensic evaluations will be conducted in a private confidential setting at C/SARA. Sexual Assault is a very traumatic experience. By providing a trained medical professional, a safe, confidential environment and victim advocacy; we can reduce the trauma for clients.

Local Medical Professionals will provide 24/7/365 coverage to respond to the calls. The nursing professionals have undergone intensive SANE-Sexual Assault Nurse Examiner training, as well as participating in clinical practice. Dr. Pamela Kimbrough is providing program oversight as the Medical Director.
